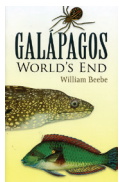


Charles Darwin

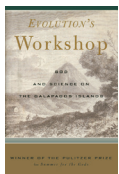


William Beebe

This wry, wonderfully evocative account of a 1924 scientific expedition includes an excellent chapter on the human history of the Galapagos. (Item GPS01)

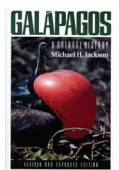

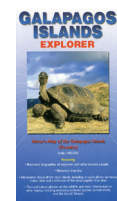

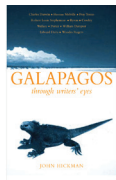


Kurt Vonnegut

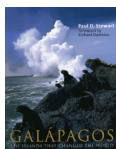

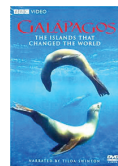
